Our school is open for 32.5 hours per week in total for a typical week of compulsory school attendance.

Safeguarding

SAFEGUARDING STATEMENT

Oakwood Junior School is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children. We follow the Derby City Safeguarding Children's Board procedures. Sometimes we may need to share information and work in partnership with other agencies, when there are concerns about a child's welfare. We will ensure that concerns about our pupils are discussed with parents/carers first, unless we have reason to believe that such a move would be contrary to the child's welfare.

Oakwood Junior School has a dedicated safeguarding team of three members of staff to ensure that the children are kept as safe as possible. Should you have any concerns about the welfare, health or safety of a child please contact one of the team. We meet as a team weekly to review any concerns and to ensure that our systems are robust.

SEND – Special Educational Needs

SEND at Oakwood Junior School

What kinds of Special Educational Needs are provided for at Oakwood Junior School?

We provide for children with a variety of additional needs and we are able to support children with difficulties in the following areas:

- **Cognition and Learning** - This area includes general difficulties with learning, profound and multiple learning difficulties (PMLD) and specific learning difficulties (SpLD) such as dyslexia (difficulties with reading and spelling) and dyscalculia (difficulties with number and calculation).
- **Communication and Interaction** - This area includes speech, language and communication needs (SLCN), which could mean difficulties with speech production, the understanding of language, the expression of language or a combination of all three. It also includes difficulties with the social use of language and pupils with autism spectrum condition (ASC).
- **Physical and Sensory** - This area includes sensory impairments, such as visual impairments (VI) and hearing impairments (HI), as well as physical disabilities such as cerebral palsy.
- **Social, Emotional and Mental Health** - This area includes children who are struggling with emotional regulation, social skills or who are dealing with a mental health difficulty. Some children may have a diagnosed disorder such as Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) or Attention Deficit Disorder (ADD) which can effect how they behave.

At Oakwood Junior School we recognise that children may have needs in more than one area and every child is different; often the area of need given to a particular child is their 'prime' area and we always look at the individual child when thinking about how best to support them.

Policies and Procedures

We aim to identify children's needs early in their school career. To do this, class teachers monitor children's progress and identify those making less than expected progress given their age and individual circumstances.

When deciding whether to make special educational provision, a meeting will be arranged between the Special Educational Needs Coordinator (SENCO), the class teacher and the parent to consider all the information gathered, including:

- The child's areas of strength and difficulties
- The views of the parent/carer and child
- Any additional support or provision the child needs
- Any referrals to outside professionals that could provide support

Where a pupil is identified as having SEND, the school will seek to remove barriers to learning and put SEND provision in place. The support will take the form of a four-part cycle, known as the graduated approach:

- **ASSESS:** an analysis of need will be carried out by all concerned, including outside agencies
- **PLAN:** an appropriate plan will be agreed by all concerned
- **DO:** agreed support and intervention will be delivered
- **REVIEW:** the effectiveness of the intervention/support will be reviewed regularly



School Uniform

We want our children to look smart whilst in school and feel that uniform gives them a sense of belonging to our community.

Our uniform consists of the following items:

Children can also wear a non-compulsory school tie with a stripe of colour for their school house. The house names and colours are as follows

It is not compulsory to wear uniform with the schools logo, plain green jumpers and cardigans can be purchased at very affordable prices in most supermarkets. If you do wish to purchase uniform with logos, you can purchase these from **Uniform Direct**, Babbington Lane, Derby.

All clothing especially coats and sweatshirts should be clearly marked with your child's name.



Home & School Communication

Here at Oakwood Junior School we believe communication between home and school is key. With this in mind we have a number of ways of communicating with parents and carers to ensure information is shared effectively. Please see below the school apps you will be asked to join when your child joins us.



Parent hub is our main source of communication between home and school. On this app you will get electronic copies of letters, important information about events, trips and meetings as well as fun activities. All letters and newsletters will be sent on this app.



Class Dojo is another app we use which is ideal for direct communication with your child's class teacher, SENCO, Deputy Head and Head Teacher. You will also see photos of events taking place in your child's class and year groups as well as the whole school. Children will also be awarded Dojo Points which are rewarded at set milestones.



We use School Monday (via Teachers2Parents) for dinner money and trip payments. On this app you can also look at the school menu and pre-book your child's meal.

Attendance

We are sure that like us, you as parents and carers realise the importance of attendance and punctuality. At Oakwood we continue to work hard to try to raise attendance levels and to reduce instances of lateness. Our target for whole school attendance is 96%

Attendance facts:

- All schools must report their termly attendance percentages to the Local Authority
- If your child is not in school s/he does not reach his/her learning potential
- If your child's attendance falls below 95% they will be monitored by the Pastoral Team and if there is no improvements, then no more absences will be authorised without evidence
- Parents have a legal responsibility to ensure that their child receives a full time education
- Parents can be issued with fixed penalty notices (fines) for failing to ensure that their child attends school regularly - this includes taking children out of school on holiday
- The local authority has the power to prosecute parents in the magistrate's court for the offence of failing to ensure their child attends school regularly.
- If your child arrives after 9:15am we are required to mark them as having unauthorised absence for the whole morning - arriving after 9:15am once in a week brings their attendance down to 90%
- If your child is late, we may not be able to order a meal of your child's choice as the kitchen has a 'deadline' that has to be adhered to so that correct numbers of meals are produced.

Children who do not attend school regularly are more likely to:


- Fall behind in their school work
- Find it difficult to make and keep friends
- Learn poor attendance habits that follow through into secondary school
- Be unhappy at school

Poor punctuality can also disadvantage children in many ways:

- Being frequently late for school adds up to lost learning - for example arriving 15 minutes late every day is the same as being absent for 2 weeks a year
- When children are late they find it harder to settle into the routine of the day
- When children arrive late they often miss key messages and teaching which continues to have an effect on their learning for the rest of the lesson or day
- Poor punctuality disrupts the class and can be embarrassing for the child

How can you help your child attend school regularly?

- Talk to your child about school
- Take a positive interest in your child's work, including homework
- Make sure your child understands why school is important
- Show your child that you are interested in what they have done at school
- Get everything ready for school the night before
- Arrange appointments before or after school or during the school holidays
- Bring your child to school for the time before or after an appointment wherever possible
- Take holidays during school holidays and not during term time
- Set your alarm and your child's alarm clock- see who can beat the clock!
- Only grant days at home for **genuine** illness (you will know!)
- If your child is slightly under the weather, still send them to school- children can start feeling better as the day goes, and if the school is worried they will call
- Children can attend school if they are taking medicines - speak to the school office. **We can give children certain prescribed medications** with a signed consent form.



School Well Being Dog



At Oakwood Junior School we understand that the well-being of the children is paramount to us all. The lockdowns, closures of schools and Covid-19 has been difficult for everyone and for these reasons we are continually evaluating and improving our mental health support so that the children are able to leave our care with resilience, positivity, aspirations, respect and kindness. To support these attributes and as part of our ongoing provision for wellbeing and mental health we have decided to invest in a Well-Being Dog for the children.

I would like to introduce you to Ron, an English springer spaniel who is a much-loved member of the Oakwood Junior School Team. Ron has joined us all the way from York where he lived with his brothers and sisters on a farm. He now spends his days in school and goes home for a well-deserved rest in the evenings with Mrs Fray. Ron loves to play and earn treats, visit the children in their classrooms, have gentle rubs, and petting under his chin.



What are the benefits of a Well-Being school dog for children (and staff)?

- Calming effect
- Reduction of stress and anxiety
- Improved self-esteem
- Fostering a sense of responsibility
- Motivation
- Encouraging respect for animals and all living things
- Respect and nurture life
- Building confidence in all areas of the curriculum
- Improving attendance

School Meals



Our delicious school meals are prepared on site by our on-site cooks provided by Mellors. They produce menus that are on a three weekly cycle, the menus are regularly reviewed and updated to ensure variety and nutrition.

School lunches can be booked on a day to day basis; you can do this by booking it the day before on school money or your child can book this in class on the day. It is not necessary to order them for the whole week in advance. Lunches are currently priced at **£2.90 per day payable on the day or in advance.**

If your child is or you think they may be entitled to free school meals please contact the school office for an application form and return to school. We currently use Entrust for our free school meal checking that can give you an instant decision for entitlement.
